MARTIN POLICE DEPARTMENT—Martin Police Chief Phillip Fuqua gave an inside look at some aspects of the department when he spoke at the April 16 Kiwanis meeting. Among other topics, Chief Fuqua discussed changes that will continue to attract highly motivated, educated, and diverse persons to strengthen the department and to provide the best services possible to the community. He also explained that the purpose of the License Plate Reader program, with cameras located at entry points in Martin, is to locate stolen vehicles, investigate felony offenses associated with violent crime, locate missing children, and to protect the community. He underscored that this program is not for surveillance of any individual, repossession of vehicles, expired tag enforcement or anything that is not in the category of violent crime. Chief Fuqua expressed appreciation for the 30 uniformed officers in Martin Police Department and all who support the mission of the department, which is stated on the MPD website as follows: "to provide protection and services to the City of Martin that will suppress criminal activity, provide a climate of safety and security to its citizens, and strive to communicate with the community in order to inform and be informed in the most effective manner possible." Chef Fugua has served in the department for 24 years and began his role as chief on July 7, 2024.
